




### Year 1 News...

Next week in Year 3 we will be comparing different types of soil in science. In Music we will be learning a stone age rock song and continuing with subtraction using the column method in maths.

# Updates from Year 4

### What is happening next week?

Next week we will be further developing our poetry skills and create a heartfelt poem dedicated to our upcoming Remembrance Day Service. We will be using our learnt skills from the valuable workshop we took part in and our new knowledge on the structure of poems to explore new words and write our well thought out, planned pieces of work.

In Maths, we will continue our theme of addition and subtraction within 10,000 and work on the next set of facts in our times table fluency, focusing on consolidating our understanding. In Geography we will revise what COP26 means and create information posters about the impacts of Climate Change and what we can do to counteract it. History will find us reviewing information about King Alfred the Great and recording some off our findings. We will have our final coaching session in Rugby; sports hall athletics continues. In Science, we continue to build and explore circuits, looking at complete/incomplete circuits and insulators/conductors. RE will see us exploring the Nepali festival of Dashain. In French, we will continue with numbers.

Homework: We will send the weekly spellings home for the children to learn, children will be tested on these the following Monday. It is a great idea for the children to look up the meaning of any words that they are not sure of.

### Things you need to know...

Crucial Crew - 23rd November: £5.00 Crucial Crew is a multi-agency event organised through schools, by the police and supported by the fire service. They aim to raise awareness of safety issues to school children in Year 6 (aged 10-11).

The event takes the form of interactive scenarios which cover topics, each educating the students in a specific risk. The children have 'hands on' experiences in what to do if they discover a fire in the home and how to make an emergency call. They will identify risks set up in the scenario and learn how to make their homes safer.
