




Appreciate

SNACK TIME

We want to develop snack time in the FSI setting.

The aim of snack time will be to:

- provide children with a variety of healthy snack options
- to give children the chance to prepare a snack
- for children to enjoy socialising with their friends while they eat

Snacks will vary each day and will rotate on a weekly basis. All children with dietary needs will be catered for.

The new snack arrangements will begin after the February half term break.

This week we will continue to
explore 'Boo- A Fishy mystery' by

We will be creating fishy art this week by creating our own fish lino prints. We will be exploring the patterns that scales make and they different tools we can use to recreate them.

We have loved exploring and investigating different types of fish and even got to touch and look at a real octopus. Miss Bell will be on the lookout for other sea creatures to explore.

We will focus on patterns in our mathematical learning and will be supporting the children to:

Talk about and identify the patterns around them. For example: stripes on clothes, designs on rugs and wallpaper. Use informal language like 'pointy', 'spotty', 'blobs', etc.

Extend and create ABAB patterns - stick, leaf, stick, leaf.


This week's stars....

What is happening next week?

The children will continue to dramatise the legend of Romulus and Remus and create their own version of this famous legend. We will further explore why, where and when the Romans came to Britain. In History we will be looking at the rise of the Roman Empire and discussing reasons for their success. In Art, the children will begin the process of designing and making a Roman shield. For Science, we will continue to investigate the different aspects of human digestion. In Computing, it will be fun to try out the surveys created by the other groups.

Homework: Spellings - please do encourage your child to make sure they understand the meaning of the words, to write them (look, say, cover, write, check) and use them within a sentence (this could be oral instead of written). Some of the children are finding the long multiplication challenging. We will be adding some extra support to seesaw and sending home some extra aids to help your child with their understanding.
