# A message from Mr M...

#### Illness

At this time of year, we can expect to see an increase in seasonal viruses and infections such as COVID-19, flu and norovirus. Community flu levels are currently increasing, with high levels of COVID-19 seen over the Christmas period and above average levels of norovirus circulating too.

Parents are still encouraged to send children to school if they exhibit mild respiratory symptoms, in order to maintain attendance. Such mild symptoms encompass a runny nose, sore throat, or a slight cough, which unfortunately in some cases may also be indicative of COVID-19 infection.

Other measures such as vaccinations, hand hygiene and environmental cleaning continue to be important for prevention and are in place across the school.

Car Parking & Roads Around School

We had a near miss last week in the large car park where one pf our parents was caught by a passing car. It is vital that we are all paying attention around the school grounds to make sure everyone is safe. Putting it bluntly, we do not want anyone getting hurt or knocked over by a car. Children can wear these for PE and Sport sessions ONLY.




#### Dates & Messages

Important - please note, for this half term, outdoor PE is on a Monday and indoor PE is on a Wednesday. Please practice the common exception word spellings at home.


#### This week's stars....
