We have a range of clubs available during the Autumn Term that commence week beginning 23rd September. ALL clubs will run for an 8 week period. Charges may apply for individual clubs.






Year 6 Residential Marrick Priory



We will also be labelling different fruits with the initial sounds we have learnt so far. In maths, we will be sorting by colour, shape and size

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Year 1/2 Ewes, Chameleons, Rainbow & Bluebirds

What a fantastic start we have had!

The children have come back to school with such positive attitudes. The children have been exploring and investigating in our new areas.

Next week the children in Year 1 will be using their phonic knowledge to write words for a range of purposes and completing a daily phonics session where they will be developing their decoding and reading skills.

In maths the children will be counting forwards and backwards from any given number. They will be reading and writing their numbers to 20.

Next week the children in Year 2 will developing their knowledge of nouns and verbs and using these to write sentences.

In maths the children will be looking at the place value of numbers in a two digit number. They will be making numbers using tens and ones and other equipment.

Throughout the week both Year 1 and Year 2 will be given a task card to complete which focuses on the other areas of the curriculum.

Special shout out to all the children for embracing this new and exciting school year!



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Year 3 Hedgehogs & Impressive Llamas

This week we have enjoyed getting stuck into our curriculum subjects. We have enjoyed retelling the Cave Baby story, then our classroom converted into a dark, gloomy cave where the children could create their own story on the walls. In English next week we will be looking at the text Stone Age Boy. We will be unpicking the text to decipher how the characters feel. In maths we have been exploring place value and extending our knowledge to include numbers to 1000. We will be exploring this further next week by looking at number patterns. Our Stone Age theme will be continuing in Art with Cave paintings, In History with life in The Stone Age and in Geography with Stone Age settlements.

All the children in Year 3 are settling in well and looking after each other.



Our PE days are Monday for indoor and Wednesday for outdoor. Children will need their appropriate PE kits on these days. The weather is changing; therefore, children will need outdoor PE kit as we will be outside for this session. A reminder that all jewellery needs to be removed. Thank you.



Year 4 Butterflies & Tigers

Next week, we will continue the story 'The Dot' and think of ways we can try new challenges and believe we can do it!

In maths, we will compare whole numbers and look at rounding numbers to nearest 1000. We launched our topic last week, so we look forward to moving to the 1940s and finding out how things have changed.

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What a great start to the Year. This first week has been fun for us all.


