


KEEPING IN TOUCH

Extra Curricular Clubs next week


As detailed on the club booking form, there will be no extra curricular clubs running next week due to Parent Consultations, All clubs will resume as normal on Monday 21st October.







We are outside everyday, please make sure that children have suitable clothing and footwear for the weather.










FS2 Bear , Cheetahs & Hippos


