

When do pupils learn multiplication facts?

- Pupils begin to chant easier multiplication facts in Year 1.
- From Y2, pupils focus on different multiplication facts so that by Year 4 all facts are taught and revised.
- Children are encouraged to learn all facts but recognise a relationship between facts so that there are only 38 to memorise, by heart.

admissions The application round opened on 12 October 2024 and closes on 15 January 2025










FS2 Bear , Cheetahs & Hippos

In PE we have being practising some mindful yoga moves, including the tree, the flamingo, the cat, child's pose, warrior and the crow. Which ones can you remember?








Each class will be preparing some Maya inspired foods to share with the block. We will give scores (like Come Dine with me!) - who will be the winning class?
