














# Well done to all our award winners this half term

### FS2 Bear , Cheetahs & Hippos

After the holidays, we will be working on the story 'The Leaf Thief' by Alice Hemming. The children will discuss the story and find out who stole squirrel's leaves. The children will be going on an Autumnal walk, collecting Autumnal items and making clay leaves. We will make leaf wreaths and do leaf rubbings.

Spelling quiz is every Friday morning.


PE Days are Monday pm and Friday am.
