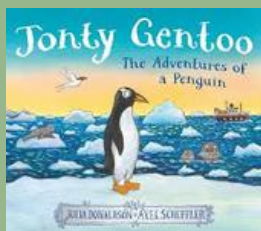
Friday 15th November

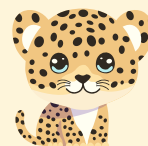

FS2 Bear, Cheetahs & Hippos

Next week in FS2 we will begin looking at the story 'Lost and Found' by Oliver Jeffers and will meet a few penguins along the way.

We will continue with 2D shapes, exploring them through a range of fun activities.

We will now be very focused on the Nativity and have begun rehearsals.

More penguins can be found in The Nest. The children will be exploring ice and winter animals. The adults will read the story of 'Jonty Gentoo' by Julie Donaldson.

The children will be creating icy pictures using cold colours like white and blue and seeing what happens to water left out over night.





Year 1/2 Ewes, Chameleons, Rainbow & Bluebirds

Next week in English, we will be continuing to use the book 'That Rabbit Belongs to Emily Brown'. We will be writing letters from the Queen to Emily Brown.

Year One will be focusing on capital letters, full stops and including more details in their sentences.

Year Two will be focusing on using emotive language to engage the reader, using rhetorical questions, using a range of conjunctions and begin to use exclamation sentences to add impact to their writing.

In Maths **Year One** will be continuing to use a range of methods to add a one and a two digit number together. We will be recognising, reading and writing mathematic symbols in context to write number sentences.

In Maths **Year Two** will be continuing to develop their knowledge and application of the column method when adding 2, two digit numbers.
