I can't believe we have reached the end of another half term and the half way point of the academic year! It has been another busy term with everyone ready for a well-earned break. School will close at the end of the day tomorrow (Friday 14th Feb) and will open again on Monday 24th Feb.

<u>Raising The Bar</u>

As part of the whole school focus, we have been looking closely at school uniform and ensuring pupils are well prepared. An updated list of PE kit can be found below. Please adhere to this as some children are arriving in school with incorrect kit. Tracksuit bottoms/leggings are not suitable for indoor PE especially when climbing and the gym equipment! Nor are hoody tops as the risk of catching the hood on equipment is much higher.

<u>Attendance</u>

It has been great to see those children with low attendance rates or punctuality concerns improve over the half term. This is really positive and the school attendance rate continues to sit above the national level. Later in the newsletter, I have shared a reminder about the new attendance procedures and thresholds. This information indicates what may happen if attendance levels are poor, if a child has 10 unauthorised sessions in a 10 week period or there are concerns around regular lateness.

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR School attendance is Changing

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.



SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered. The following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after **19th** August 2024.



THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or Irregular Attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates; fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education'.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHOURISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthourised absence in a 10-week period.







FS1 & 2 Year Olds




Year 1/2 Ewes, Chameleons, Rainbow & Bluebirds
